


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Petr Hlinený is Professor of Computer Science and a former Vice-dean for research, development and doctoral studies at Masaryk University, Brno, Czech Republic. His research interests, at the interplay of discrete mathematics and theoretical computer science, lie in complexity theory and algorithms, sometimes using tools from logic, in graphs on surfaces, and in geometric representations of graphs and their recognition. He has obtained several awards: among the most recent ones, a «top cited article 2005-2010» from the Journal of Combinatorial Theory, series B, and a Graph Drawing 2019 best paper award.
