


Professor Leda Papastefanaki

Leda Papastefanaki has published extensively on the social and economic history of industrialization and labour, social history of technology, mining history, urban history, history of occupational health, gender history, oral history, industrial archaeology, Jewish history, history of the Mediterranean, global history, public history.

The project "Urban networks, infrastructures, engineers. Looking at the modernization process through the lens of a mid-size (Ottoman/Greek) town : Ioannina, 1860s-1960s" seeks to deepen further the historiographical debate on the technological modernization of Greece in general and, more specifically, the modernization process that the country's urban landscape underwent in terms of the role of businesses, engineers, urban networks, infrastructure, and technology transfer. The project attempts to change the scale of analysis, with a focus on a mid-sized town of Northwest Greece, Ioannina.
